

Hiking in Ischgl: summer adventures in the Alps

In summer, Ischgl becomes a paradise for hikers. Surrounded by the breathtaking mountains of the Tyrolean Alps, the region offers a wide range of hiking trails suitable for all levels of experience. State-of-the-art summer cable cars, guided tours and unique experiences such as the smugglers' tour make Ischgl a versatile destination for nature lovers.

Hiking trails and nature experiences

Ischgl has an extensive network of 200 kilometres of marked hiking trails. The routes are well signposted and divided into different levels of difficulty so that both families with children and experienced mountaineers get their money's worth. Popular tours lead through idyllic valleys, past alpine pastures and mountain lakes, and offer spectacular views of the peaks of the Silvretta and Verwall mountains at many points. Some of the tours in the Fimba Valley and over the peaks of the ski area also cross the border into Switzerland.

Summer cable cars: Convenient ascent

The summer cable car in Ischgl is available for hikers who want to reach the higher regions quickly and easily. From the end of June to the beginning of October, the cable cars take hikers up to an altitude of 2,872 metres directly to the Swiss border. The cable cars provide access to many high-altitude hiking trails that would otherwise be difficult to reach and offer an excellent starting point for day and summit tours.

With the Silvretta Card Premium, which many holidaymakers use, travel on the cable cars is free. This card also offers discounts on many other leisure activities in the region.

Smugglers' tour from Ischgl to Samnaun

One of the most famous tours in Ischgl is the historic smugglers' tour from Ischgl to Samnaun. This tour, which was once used by smugglers, leads through the high alpine landscape of the Silvretta. With the help of five cable cars and chairlifts, the route can be completed in comfort, allowing hikers to relax and enjoy the breathtaking mountain panorama. The Smugglers' Tour is a popular route for both hikers and mountain bikers and combines history and nature in an exciting way.

Bike & Hike: a combination of cycling and hiking

Ischgl not only offers classic hikes, but also the popular (e-)bike & hike concept, which combines mountain bike tours with hikes. The idea is to ride a mountain bike to the starting point of a hiking route and then continue the tour on foot. This allows you to reach remote peaks and mountain pastures

more quickly, giving you more flexibility when planning your tour. There are 25 marked bike & hike routes in the region, which are suitable for both beginners and advanced athletes.
